As of June 24, 2020, Travel Advice and Warning on Infectious Diseases which is issued by Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Japan is at level 2 worldwide (Mostly at level 3). According to the Travel Guidelines above, University of Tsukuba does not allow students to travel abroad until it is at level 1.
